HUD Announces Funding Awards for Homeless Programs

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has announced a funding award of approximately \$9.2 million in renewal funds to assist homeless programs in Columbus and Franklin County. These funds represent the major source of federal assistance to meet the housing and supportive service needs of people experiencing homelessness.

The Continuum of Care grants will provide funding for 33 renewal projects in Columbus and Franklin County that represent 1,162 units of housing for families and individuals.

Also included in the 2013 Continuum of Care application submission was a proposal for Van Buren Village, a new supportive housing community being developed by Volunteers of America of Greater Ohio. Van Buren Village will provide 100 units of permanent supportive housing, with more than half of the units prioritized for people with disabilities who have experienced long-term or repeated homelessness. Volunteers of America of Greater Ohio will open Van Buren Village in May 2015. HUD anticipates announcing new project awards in the coming weeks.
